PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY, the 6th ordinary, is the last 'green Sunday' till mid-June. In the gospel We see both the divine power and the divine compassion of Jesus in the act of healing the leper. The divine power was necessary in all instantaneous cures. Even if the diseases were curable, the ordinary process of nature took time to fight off the causes and to return to normality. Therefore, where there was an instantaneous recovery some power above nature, some supernatural cause brought it about. But where the disease was incurable, as real leprosy then was, to remove it by a simple word of command was more emphatically still the result of divine power. This divine power Jesus had, for he was himself divine, the Son of God.

THIS SUNDAY coincides with the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes. Even though that feast day is not celebrated because of its coincidence with Sunday, it is still **the World Day of Prayer** for the sick. In his recommendation for the celebration of this day, Pope Francis refers to the need of keeping company with those who are sick to give them active support and prayerful encouragement.

THE SEASON OF LENT begins on Wednesday. You will note that two Masses are timetabled, both with the imposition of ashes. The season of Lent is the third liturgical season of the year. It runs from Ash Wednesday through to Maundy Thursday. It is a time of prayer penance, fasting and almsgiving. Ash Wednesday itself is one of the two remaining days in the churches calendar for fasting and abstinence. The forty days of Lent reflect the forty days Jesus spent in prayer & fasting in the wilderness, being tempted betimes by the devil. Being a season of restraint, the Gloria is not sung at Mass; the joyful acclamation "alleluia" is not used; flowers do not decorate our church. Also music is more restrained and simply supportive. Of course, when we come to mid-Lent and Laetare Sunday, we ease back on the restraint a little. Please try to come to Mass to begin your Lenten journey with holy determination

SAINTS ALIVE St Methodius (826? - 885) was born in Thessalonica. With his brother Cyril he went to Moravia to preach the faith. They translated liturgical texts into the Slavonic language and invented the Glagolitic and possibly also the Cyrillic alphabet. After his brother's death he went to Pannonia, where he was assiduous in the work of evangelization. In the complicated international politics of the time he suffered much from attacks by his enemies, but he was always supported by the Popes. He died on 6 April 885. St Cyril (827? - 869) was born in Thessalonica and was educated in Constantinople. With his brother Methodius he went to Moravia to preach the faith. They translated liturgical texts into the Slavonic language and invented the Glagolithic and possibly also the Cyrillic alphabet. They were called back to Rome, where Cyril died on 14 February 869.

CATHOLIC FASTING RULES FOR ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENTEN FRIDAYS Catholics age 14 and older do not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent, including Good Friday. Instead of meat many Catholics choose to eat fish. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics age 18 to 59 also limit the amount of food they eat. Only one full meal, and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal, are eaten. The best rule of thumb is to make sure your meals are smaller than what you would eat on a normal day - and to avoid snacks. Exemption is allowed for pregnant women and those who need regular meals for medical reasons. "Fasting" is the word used when the amount of food eaten is limited. "Abstinence" is when you completely give something up, like meat, for a set period. But enjoy your pancakes on Shrove Tuesday!

SIMONY is the act of selling church offices and roles or sacred things. It is named after Simon Magus, who is described in the Acts of the Apostles as having offered two disciples of Jesus payment in exchange for their empowering him to impart the power of the Holy Spirit to anyone on whom he would place his hands. The term extends to other forms of trafficking for money in "spiritual things".

THE PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH are as follows: 1.Attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. 2. Confession of serious sin at least once a year. 3. Reception of Holy Communion at least once a year - ordinarily during the period of Easter Duties from Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. 4 .Observance of the days of fast and abstinence.5. Providing for the needs of the Church.
