## **PARISH NOTES**

THIS SUNDAY We return to the long stretch of Ordinary Time (summer in the Northern hemisphere), which takes us to Advent. The focus is on the preaching of Jesus on the Kingdom of God, and also on his miracles that manifest the power of God. These stories (prayed as part of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary) unfold within the context of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem toward his passion, death and resurrection. Today's Gospel from Luke is the story of the sending of the seventy-two disciples to prepare for his coming. Keep in mind that 72 is a symbolic number from Genesis 10 that represents the nations of the world. At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant, but the labourers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out labourers to his harvest... Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' . . . Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.'" The Kingdom of God is revealed in the witness of the disciples and the healing power of Christ.

NEXT SUNDAY is 'Stella Maris' or Sea Sunday. A second collection will be taken for the Apostleship of the Sea .

**THE GOSPEL** The instructions to the seventy-two sent out are direct and simple. They are really sent out like lambs among wolves, without food, without distractions, without baggage, without spares. The version in the Gospel of Mark allows them sandals, presumably to enable them to make more speed on their journey, for the urgency of the task is paramount. They are not to be distracted by picking and choosing their accommodation or their food. Direct, too, is their method: to impart the blessing of peace and to heal. No second chance: if the blessing is rejected, away they go, leaving the town to a fate worse than that of Sodom! Again the absolute demands of Jesus! There is a wonderful simplicity about this message of the coming of the Kingdom: all that is involved is peace and healing. No squabbles, no fripperies, no complications of doctrine. If these can remain the focus of our Christian vision we may make some progress towards bringing the Kingdom of God to reality in our own surroundings. SAINTS ALIVE: ST BENEDICT was born in Nursia, in Umbria, and studied in Rome; but he was unable to stomach the dissolute life of the city, and he became a solitary hermit at Subiaco. His reputation spread, and some monks asked him to be their abbot; but they did not like the discipline he imposed and tried to poison him. Benedict organised various small communities of monks and nuns in various places, including the great monastery of Monte Cassino. He drew up a set of rules to guide the communal life of monasteries. Although this was not the first monastic rule ever, the Rule of St Benedict has proved so wise and balanced that it has served as the foundation of practically every attempt at communal living ever since – and not only in religious communities. The Rule of St Benedict recognises that people aim at perfection but often fall well short of it, and aims to be a "rule for beginners" in which even the least perfect and least able can grow in spiritual stature. To visit a Benedictine monastery of almost any kind is to find oneself spending time among a group of people who, by their strivings to live and grow together, have become more and more themselves, as God intended them, instead of being crushed into false uniformity by some idealistic and authoritarian regime.
