PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY Pope Benedict writes: 'On this Sunday the gospel according to St Matthew recounts the birth of Jesus from Joseph's viewpoint. He was betrothed to Mary, who before they came together was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit. St Joseph is presented as a just man faithful to God's law and ready to do his will. Having given up the idea of divorcing Mary secretly, Joseph took her to himself because he then saw God's work in her with his own eyes. Although he had felt distressed, Joseph did as the Angel of the Lord commanded him, certain that he was doing the right thing . . . the new man is outlined in him. He looks with trust and courage to the future. He does not follow his own plans that entrusts himself without reserve to the infinite mercy of the one who will fulfil the prophecies and open the time of salvation.'

THE GOSPEL Matthew begins his gospel about the birth of Jesus with a long and elaborately formal genealogy of Joseph. But Jesus is the son of Mary, not of Joseph! The whole point of this story is that Joseph is not the genealogical father of Jesus, but adopts Jesus into his line of David. At first he is hesitant to do so, presumably thinking that he is unworthy to acknowledge the child as his own, and unworthy to bond with Mary who is with child by the Holy Spirit. But the angel insists ('Do not be afraid') that only Joseph can do this job. As soon as the child is born, he is given the name Jesus, and given it by Joseph. It is the father's prerogative to name a son, and by so doing Joseph takes the child as his own. We hear little more of Joseph, but what a joy it must have been to have Jesus as a son! What a relationship there must have been! What responsibility too! When Jesus calls God his 'Father', he is using the concept which must have been formed in his mind by his adoptive father, Joseph, the perfect ideal of the loving father.

The Advent wind begins to stir
With sea-like sounds in our Scotch
fir,
It's dark at breakfast, dark at tea,
And in between we only see
Clouds hurrying across the sky
And rain-wet roads the wind blows
dry
And branches bending to the gale
Against great skies all silver pale
The world seems travelling into space,
And travelling at a faster pace
Than in the leisured summer weather
When we and it sit out together,
For now we feel the world spin round
On some momentous journey bound -
Journey to what? to whom? to where?
The Advent bells call out 'Prepare,
Your world is journeying to the birth

And how, in fact, do we prepare
The great day that waits us there -
For the twenty-fifth day of December,

The birth of Christ? For some it
means

An interchange of hunting scenes
On coloured cards, And I remem-
ber

Last year I sent out twenty yards,
Laid end to end, of Christmas cards
To people that I scarcely know -
